Ovarian cancer is a group of diseases that originates in the ovaries, or in the related areas of the fallopian tubes and the peritoneum. There is no screening test for ovarian cancer, and only about 20% of ovarian cancers are found at an early stage. When ovarian cancer is found early, about 94% of patients live longer than 5 years after diagnosis. This virtual event will include presentations from ovarian cancer specialists, a genetic counselor, and an ovarian cancer survivor.
